How to Grade a Pattern Up or Down a Size (or Two) - Itch

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Pattern Grading is the process whereby patterns of different sizes are produced from the original master pattern. This process can be performed manually or automatically by a computerized system. Patterns are graded according to size charts which present the sizes and the average measurements of the population group for which the garments are intended.

Easy: Slash your pattern piece in the same way and instead of spreading the pieces, overlap them following the same calculations, like on this drawing: spread and overlap method for pattern grading . Method #2: The shift method. Now, if you want to increase or decrease a multi-size pattern instead of just one size, the shifting method is quite handy.

Now you know the three most important fundamentals for grading your patterns and use the sizes that truly correspond to yours. So let's follow a step by step example of this technique: For this tutorial, I'm using my T-shirt pattern for Women Thimble-T. On this pattern, I am size XXL of chest and waist and size 4XL of hips.

Pattern grading is the method used to create a range of sized for a single style. You can grade your sewing patterns, if needed - for example, if you're making a set of dresses for bridesmaids.

Pattern Grading and Sizing

Grading has a very particular meaning when it is applied to patterns: A pattern grade is a set of predetermined (by the designer of an apparel line), generally regular, arithmetical relationships between sizes in a particular garment's size range to fit a general size body.

How to Grade a Pattern Up: The Easy Way

Pattern grading, most simply put, is the proportional increase, or decrease in the size of a pattern. The purpose of grading is to fit a range of body types and sizes from one base pattern style. Each pattern piece is methodically increased or decreased to create a new size, while keeping the same intended fit, shaping, and proportion of the original base pattern. Pattern grading should not be confused with pattern alterations.

Grading a sewing pattern

This is straight up grading from the average sizing of the pattern, not plus size grading. This method may not work for everyone, although I use it to grade up nearly every pattern that I use. First off, if this your first time grading up a pattern, I recommend using a pattern company with sizing that you are familiar with.

The indie pattern companies, such as Jalie and Silhouette also evenly grade their patterns, although some patterns have huge size ranges, so they may evenly grade only within a sub-range. For example, misses 8 to 16 are evenly graded, and women's 18 to 24 are evenly graded.
