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In 1983, the ANA published Peer Review

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According to the American Nurses Association, peer review is the process by which professionals from common practice areas systematically assess, monitor, make judgments, and provide feedback to peers by comparing actual practice to established standards. 110 Many health care organizations, such as The Joint Commission's hospital accreditation process and the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Magnet Recognition Program[®], have peer review components in their standards.

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
